Foundation seeking some help

The Nanaimo Foundation wants help identifying where the needs are in the community.

The foundation, a non-profit community organization that connects donors to charities and other worthwhile causes, has launched its second-annual "quality of life" survey for the Nanaimo region.

The city-wide survey, which can be found on the foundation's website at www.nanaimofoundation.com/vital-signs, asks residents to assess a number of different areas of city life and give them grades from A to F. Daniel Martinez, the development director for the Nanaimo Foundation, said more than 900 people completed the survey in 2014, and the foundation is hoping for a lot more to participate this year.
